EXCHANGE OF NOTES CONSTITUTING AN AGREEMENT¹
BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND
PARAGUAY RELATING TO THE PEACE CORPS

Excellency :

I have the honor to refer to recent conversations between representatives of our two governments and to propose the following understandings with respect to the men and women of the United States of America who volunteer to serve in the Peace Corps and who, at the request of your Government, would live and work for periods of time in Paraguay.

1. The Government of the United States will furnish such Peace Corps Volunteers as may be requested by the Government of Paraguay and approved by the Government of the United States to perform mutually agreed tasks in Paraguay. The Volunteers will work under the immediate supervision of governmental or private organizations in Paraguay designated by our two governments. The Government of the United States will provide training to enable the Volunteers to perform more effectively their agreed tasks. The Government of the United States will accept whatever contribution the Government of Paraguay may be disposed to make toward covering the requirements of the Peace Corps program in Paraguay.

2. The Government of Paraguay will accord equitable treatment to the Volunteers and their property; afford them full aid and protection, including treatment no less favorable than that accorded generally to nationals of the United States residing in Paraguay; and fully inform, consult and cooperate with representatives of the Government of the United States with respect to all matters concerning them. The Government of Paraguay will exempt the Volunteers from all taxes on payments which they receive to defray their living costs and on income from sources outside Paraguay, from all customs duties or other charges on their personal property introduced into Paraguay for their own use at or about the time of their arrival, with the exception of automobiles, alcoholic beverages and cigarettes, and from all other taxes or other charges (including immigration fees) except license fees and taxes or other charges included in the price of equipment, supplies, and services.

3. The Government of the United States will provide the Volunteers with such limited amounts of equipment and supplies as our two governments may agree should be provided by it to enable the Volunteers to perform their tasks effectively.
