Excellency :

I have the honor to refer to recent conversations between representatives of our two Governments and to propose the following understandings with respect to the men and women of the United States of America who volunteer to serve in the Peace Corps and who, at the request of your Government, would live and work for periods of time in the Central African Republic.

1. The Government of the United States will furnish such Peace Corps Volunteers as may be requested by the Government of the Central African Republic and approved by the Government of the United States to perform mutually agreed tasks in the Central African Republic. The Volunteers will work under the immediate supervision of governmental or private organizations in the Central African Republic designated by our two Governments. The Government of the United States will provide training to enable the Volunteers to perform more effectively their agreed tasks.

2. The Government of the Central African Republic will accord equitable treatment to the Volunteers and their property; afford them full aid and protection, including treatment no less favorable than that accorded generally to nationals of the United States residing in the Central African Republic; and fully inform, consult and cooperate with representatives of the Government of the United States with respect to all matters concerning them. The Government of the Central African Republic will exempt the Volunteers from all taxes on payments which they receive to defray their living costs and on income from sources outside the Central African Republic, from all customs duties or other charges on their personal property introduced into the Central African Republic
