AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN THE UNITED NATIONS AND THE SOUTH PACIFIC COMMISSION FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A REGIONAL TRAINING COURSE IN BOATBUILDING, REPAIRS AND ENGINE MAINTENANCE, AT AUKI, MALAITA, BRITISH SOLOMON ISLANDS PROTECTORATE. SIGNED AT NEW YORK, ON 24 JANUARY 1963, AND AT NOUMEA, NEW CALEDONIA, ON 20 FEBRUARY 1963

PREAMBLE

Whereas the South Pacific Commission acting at the request and on behalf of its Member Governments (Australia, France, the Netherlands, New Zealand, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America) has requested technical assistance from the United Nations in the establishment of a second two-year English-speaking Regional Training Course in Boatbuilding, Repairs and Engine Maintenance (hereinafter called "the Course"), to be situated at Auki, Malaita, British Solomon Islands Protectorate ; and

Whereas the United Nations is prepared to render technical assistance in connexion with the Course, subject to the availability of the necessary funds ;

The United Nations and the South Pacific Commission, (hereinafter called the "SPC"), acting at the request and on behalf of its Member Governments, have agreed as follows :

Article I

1. The Course, which is scheduled to commence approximately in March 1963, shall aim at contributing substantially toward the improvement of the boat-building industry in the South Pacific region by giving instruction in the necessary skills and demonstrations, over the two-year programme, to a maximum of twenty-four (24) trainees, twenty-one of whom are expected to be nominated by territorial Governments in the Southwest Pacific Area, as agreed by Member Governments of the SPC, and three of whom are expected to be nominated by other Governments
