NO. 803. AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM AND THE ROYAL NORWEGIAN GOVERNMENT RELATING TO THE PARTICIPATION OF A NORWEGIAN BRIGADE GROUP IN THE OCCUPATION OF THE BRITISH ZONE IN GERMANY. SIGNED AT LONDON, ON 5 JUNE 1947

PREAMBLE

The Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Royal Norwegian Government, desiring to make arrangements for the participation of a Norwegian contingent in the occupation of the British Zone of Germany, have agreed as follows :—

Article 1

The Norwegian Government will provide a contingent consisting of a brigade group (some 4,000 men) to take part in the occupation of the British Zone in Germany. The organisation of this contingent shall be in accordance with the order of battle that is from time to time agreed upon by the two contracting Governments.

Article 2

The Government of the United Kingdom recognise the right of the Norwegian Government to recall the contingent at very short notice, if considerations regarding the safety of Norway should render this necessary.

Article 3

The contingent will remain as a whole under Norwegian administration and jurisdiction, although for operational purposes it will serve under the overall command of the General Officer Commanding-in-Chief, British Army of the Rhine, and directly under the command of the British General Officer in whose area the brigade group is located. The contingent will be administered and maintained in accordance with arrangements set forth in a separate agreement.

Article 4

The Norwegian Army High Command will be represented in Germany by a General Officer with a Headquarters who will act as a link between
