AGREEMENT¹ ON CO-OPERATION BETWEEN THE COUNCIL FOR MUTUAL ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE AND THE UNITED NATIONS INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT ORGANIZATION

The Council for Mutual Economic Assistance, hereinafter referred to as CMEA, and the United Nations Industrial Development Organization, hereinafter referred to as UNIDO,

Guided by a desire to further, on the basis of equality and mutual advantage, co-operation between the member States of both organizations in matters relating to industrialization,

Proceeding from the fact that the member countries of CMEA support the legitimate aspiration of the developing countries to achieve and consolidate their political independence and economic self-reliance, and are developing mutually advantageous economic, scientific and technical co-operation with them,

Intending to assist in the restructuring of international economic relations and the establishment of a new international economic order on a just and democratic basis, with due allowance for the importance of industrial development and co-operation in the attainment of these goals, in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Declaration and Programme of Action on the Establishment of a New International Economic Order, adopted by the General Assembly of the United Nations in its resolutions 3201 (S-VI)² and 3202 (S-VI)³ of 1 May 1974, the Charter of Economic Rights and Duties of States (resolution 3281 (XXIX) of 12 December 1974)⁴ and the Lima Declaration and Plan of Action, adopted by the Second General Conference of UNIDO in March 1975,⁵

Taking into account the experience within CMEA in achieving economic, scientific and technical co-operation and in developing the socialist economic integration of the member countries of CMEA which can be used by the developing countries and by UNIDO, and also the experience of UNIDO's activities which can be used by CMEA,

Bearing in mind the favourable results of co-operation between CMEA and UNIDO which have been achieved thus far,

Convinced that co-operation between them will contribute to the social and economic development and the speedier industrialization of the developing countries,

Desiring to expand still further co-operation between them on the basis of the provisions of documents defining the respective mandates of CMEA and UNIDO,

In an endeavour to establish a general framework for and possible forms of co-operation between CMEA and UNIDO in areas of interest to both organizations,
