EXCHANGE OF LETTERS CONSTITUTING AN AGREEMENT¹
BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE FRENCH REPUBLIC
AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNION OF SOVIET
SOCIALIST REPUBLICS CONCERNING THE ACTIVITIES OF
SOVIET FISHING VESSELS IN THE ECONOMIC ZONE OF THE
KERGUELEN ISLANDS

Moscow, 5 November 1988

Sir,

I have the honour to refer to Decree No. 78-144 of 3 February 1978 establishing, in pursuance of the law of 16 July 1976, an economic zone off the coasts of the French Southern Lands, to the agreements entered into by the Government of the French Republic and the Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics on 29 September 1979, 22 November 1980, 2 August 1982, 3 August 1984 and 8 August 1986 on the fishing conditions for Soviet vessels in the economic zone (hereinafter called the zone) off the Kerguelen Islands, and to the Franco-Soviet talks aimed at concluding a new agreement.

I have the honour to propose the following:

Soviet fishing vessels shall be authorized to carry on fishing activities in the zone under the conditions specified hereinafter:

1. The competent French authorities shall grant licences for fishing in the zone to Soviet vessels in respect of which the French Government has recognized that right.

2. The quantities of catch authorized, the maximum number of vessels holding a fishing licence and simultaneously present in the zone and the maximum number of fishing days permitted are indicated in annexes I and II, which shall constitute an integral part of this Agreement.

3. The vessels shall implement the provisions of French regulations in force governing the conditions for obtaining fishing rights by foreign vessels in the economic zones off the coasts of French Overseas Territories (namely, Decree No. 78-963 of 19 September 1978 and its implementing texts and on the conservation of the living resources of the sea (namely, Law No. 66-400 of 18 June 1966, Decree No. 69-408 of 25 April 1969 and its implementing texts or subsequent texts).

4. Applications for authorization to put in and moor in French territorial waters off the Kerguelen Islands shall be addressed to the competent French authorities.

It is further recalled that the provision of water supplies to Soviet fishing and support vessels shall be subject to prior authorization by the competent French authorities and may take place only in the locations and under the conditions stipulated in the authorization.

5. The Soviet Party shall transmit through the diplomatic channel at least one month before the beginning of each fishing period a fishing plan and a list of vessels for which it requires licences. The fishing periods are set forth in annex I.

The lists shall be drawn up in conformity with the provisions of article 3 of Decree No. 78-963 of 19 September 1978.

The Soviet Party may request authorization to amend the list of vessels referred to in the first paragraph of this article. Requests by the Soviet Party to amend the list of vessels shall be sent to the competent French authorities through the diplomatic channel. The French Party undertakes to respond to such requests as soon as possible.

6. At the request of the French authorities, up to two French scientific observers or fishing specialists may board each vessel fishing in the zone under the Soviet flag.

The observers and specialists shall be provided with accommodation and food of officer standard. Their presence on board will constitute a mutual advantage for the two Parties.

The French Party may request that observers or specialists board a Soviet vessel at its last port of call before arriving in the zone of the Kerguelen Islands. In this case, the licence shall be delivered to the vessel in question by the observer or specialist.

7. The transfer of catches from fishing vessels under the Soviet flag shall take place under the supervision of the French authorities at Port-aux-Français or in any other suitable location in territorial waters or the zone designated by the French authorities.

8. A shipping agent who shall be financially responsible shall be designated in France by the Soviet Party.

9. The Soviet Party shall supply the French Party with statistical information on a six-monthly basis concerning the monthly catches made in the zone of the Kerguelen Islands.

The statistics shall include, by catch sectors 3° on either side of latitude 40° 30' South and longitude 69° East:

- The catches in tons and by species;
- The average number of vessels;
- The fishing effort.

10. The Soviet Party shall pay to the competent French authorities a predetermined sum of money for fishing rights (a condition for the granting of licences). This sum shall be paid in accordance with the arrangements set forth in annex I hereto, which shall constitute an integral part of this Agreement.

The granting of licences shall be conditional upon advance payment for the fishing rights. The duration of the licences shall not exceed that of the validity of this Agreement.

11. The Soviet Party shall also communicate to the local authorities the number and characteristics of accompanying vessels in the zone to service the fishing vessels.

French scientific observers may be taken aboard the vessels in question.

12. This Agreement shall not affect the positions of principle of the Contracting Parties in the context of international agreements.

13. This Agreement shall remain in force from 1 January 1989 to 30 September 1991.

Either Party may, two months before this Agreement expires, request its renewal or amendment. In that case the results of the Agreement in particular shall be taken into account.

If these provisions are acceptable to you, I have the honour to suggest that this letter and your reply shall constitute an Agreement between the Government of the French Republic and the Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics which shall enter into force on 1 January 1989.

⁽¹⁾ The periods of time spent transferring catches and embarking and disembarking observers shall be deducted from the number of days spent in the zone by fishing vessels under the Soviet flag.

⁽²⁾ All the relevant data for the second and third years of the Agreement shall be determined by common agreement between the two Parties before 1 August 1989 and 1 August 1990, respectively.

⁽³⁾ The maximum number of fishing vessels in the zone shall include one vessel searching for fish, the activities of which shall be governed by the conditions set forth in annex III.

⁽⁴⁾ The fishing periods defined in article 5 of the Agreement are the following:

— From 1 October to 30 April and from 1 July to 30 September.

In the first year in which the Agreement is in force, the first fishing period shall begin on 1 January 1989.
