MEMORANDUM¹ ON CULTURAL COOPERATION

Spain and Canada,

Inspired by a common desire to promote and develop cooperation between the two countries in the fields of culture, academic relations and sports;

Convinced that such cooperation will contribute to the furtherance of mutual understanding and friendship that exist between the two countries;

Have reached the following understanding:

Article I

Both Parties will encourage the exchange between the two countries of scholars, teachers, researchers, students, artists, members of cultural and academic institutions and other persons engaging in cultural, scientific or academic activities.

Both Parties will encourage close cooperation between the cultural and academic institutions of the two countries. They will also encourage exchange visits by scholars, teachers or researchers to give lectures, carry out research, participate in seminars, lectures and conferences and to exchange information.

Article II

Both Parties will endeavour to promote the establishment and development of links and programmes that contribute to strengthening the cultural and academic relations between the two countries.

Article III

Each Party will endeavour to provide the nationals of the other country with scholarships and other facilities for study, training or research in its own territory.

Article IV

Each Party will encourage the creation and development at universities and other academic institutions of professional chairs, other teaching posts and courses in the language, literature, history, geography, legal system, economy and culture of the other country.

Article V

Each Party will accord, in its own territory, to the persons set out in Article I who are nationals of the other country every possible facility for access to art galleries, museums, libraries, archives, documentation centres and other establishments of a cultural or educational nature.

Article VI

Each Party will, to the extent possible, encourage and facilitate the understanding of the culture, history, economy, science and technology, institutions and general way of life of the other country, especially by means of:
