DECLARATION¹ OF PRINCIPLES AND DIRECTIONS OF COOPERATION BETWEEN THE REPUBLIC OF INDIA AND ROMANIA

The Republic of India and Romania, hereinafter mentioned as "The Sides",

RECALLING the historical and cultural affinity of their peoples and countries and the tradition of friendship and cooperation,

EXPRESSING deep interest in developing multifaceted cooperation between India and Romania to the mutual benefit of their peoples,

NOTING that there existed a broad identity of views on important international political and economic issues and on the need to build a more just and equitable international order,

EXPRESSING their commitment to achieving a Nuclear Weapon-free and Non-violent World,

NOTING that they share the common ideals of peace, democracy, fundamental freedoms and human rights,

CONVINCED that greater friendship between them would further the cause of international peace and security,

HEREBY DECLARE THAT :

Article 1

Relations between India and Romania would be governed by the principles of mutual respect for independence, national sovereignty, territorial integrity and of non-interference in each other's internal affairs.

Article 2

Both Sides would adhere to the purposes and principles of the United Nations Charter and would strive for further enhancing the role of the UN. They would cooperate in the framework of the international organizations, especially in the U.N.O.

Article 3

The Republic of India respects the policy of Romania of cooperation with all the states of the world and its efforts to contribute towards the maintenance of peace in Europe and in the world and to international cooperation.
