No. 4377. EXCHANGE OF NOTES CONSTITUTING AN AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN BELGIUM AND MOROCCO FOR THE ABOLITION OF THE TRAVEL VISA REQUIREMENT BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES. RABAT, 6 FEBRUARY AND 9 AND 12 APRIL 1958

The Embassy of Belgium at Rabat presents its compliments to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and has the honour to state that the Belgian Government would be prepared to negotiate an agreement with the Moroccan Government for the abolition of travel visas for Belgians visiting Morocco and Moroccans visiting Belgium.

The waiver of the visa requirement would apply only in the case of visits not exceeding three months in duration.

The Embassy of Belgium accordingly proposes to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs the conclusion of an agreement on the lines of the draft agreement three copies of which are annexed hereto.²

If the Moroccan Government is prepared to enter into such an agreement, the agreement might be concluded by a simple exchange of letters or notes.

The date of the entry into force of the agreement should preferably be the first day of a month and should be such as to allow sufficient time for the necessary instructions to be sent to the Belgian services concerned.
